STALLS/SHAVINGS/RV RESERVATIONS:

Please contact the Ford Idaho Horse Park at www.fordidahocenter.com or 208-442-3335 for stall maps, premium stall pricing information, and to make all stall reservations. Standard stall rate is \$250/each (10 nights; Thursday Oct 2nd check-in thru Sunday Oct 12th check-out)—collected by FIHP. Premium stall locations are \$25/\$50 additional for the week. Horses entered in youth classes only can receive a \$75 credit in the show office (see show secretary for details). Single-day stall rate are available for \$65/day (location made by FIHP). Shavings, pellets, and hay are available from FIHP. FIHP does not permit the use of outside shavings or pellets. Local horses not stalled at the FIHP shall pay a \$30/horse haul-in fee (one fee for entire show), payable to the show secretary. All overnight horses must be in a stall. **NOTE—Stalls NOT cancelled by Monday, September 22nd, 2025 will incur a \$50 cancellation fee per stall plus a restocking fee for preordered shavings.** RV hookups are available on-site through the FIHP (please book early); additional overnight camper/trailer parking may be available on-site for self-sufficient units through the FIHP for a small fee.

PAID WARMUPS & OPEN ARENA HOURS:

Open riding in the indoor arena will be available from approximately 11:00 AM to 10:00 PM on Thursday October 2nd; from 5:00 AM to 6:00 AM on Friday October 3rd and periodically during paid warmups. Paid warmups will only run on Friday, October 3rd from 6 AM-10 PM, with periodic hours of open arena. Paid warmups are limited, please call or text **Stephanie at 208-390-0283**. The arena will be open following Friday's last paid warmup and every evening following each day's classes until approximately 7:15 AM the next day. However, each night the FIHP arena crew will shut down the arena from 2:00-4:00 AM as needed to prepare the ground for the next day's classes. The outdoor coverall arena will be open all day Friday, October 3rd and after each day's classes in that arena. The Stampede outdoor arena (warm up pen) will be open every day.



TROPHIES, PRIZES, & PAY OUT SCHEDULES: In addition to each NRHA class being awarded trophies based on NRHA guidelines (Lawson, Morrison, Morgan, and Plaques); there will be prizes awarded for 1st through 5th places in all single-slatted classes (Green Reiner and aged events) and circuit prizes awarded for 1st through 5th in all the multi-slatted classes (based on total scores). There will also be many significant special show and class sponsor prizes awarded. The NRHA Short Stirrup circuit champion will be listed on the perpetual bronze trophy sponsored by Garden Creek Ranch (Stub and Janice Free). The NRHA Masters circuit champion will be listed on the perpetual bronze trophy sponsored by Rock Creek Reining Horses (Jackson & Stephanie Porath) and Mountain Crest Cabinets (CJ Parks). See the complete list of prizes for all classes. All Aged Events and \$2,000 added ancillary classes will pay-out using NRHA payback schedule "B" (deeper payout); all other classes will use schedule "A" (normal schedule).

TOP TEN WORLD FINALIST YEAR END AWARDS IN LIEU OF YEAR END PRIZES: GWRHA will forever more **not** be handing out GWRHA year end awards, as we did in 2023; however, we will be giving out special awards to ALL Top Ten World Finalists who have utilized GWRHA shows to get there. In 2024 we had 48 Top Ten World Finalists, including 9 World Champions and 2 Reserve World Champions! 2025 Top Ten Finalist Awards will be handed out at a special event at the 2026 TKO Show. Get the required 7 paychecks in your class and make a run to be a Top Ten Finalist!

NEW FOR 2025 LRRC—LEGENDS CLASS: GWRHA is proud to offer two ancillary slates (with circuit prizes) for our 70 and over aged riders!

NEW FOR 2025 LRRC—FREESTYLE CLASSES: GWRHA is excited to partner with our friends from **PBfit** and provide a night of Freestyle fun and entertainment! There will be a \$2,000 Open, \$2,000 Non Pro, and a \$500 Youth division—complete with 2 special NRHA Lawson Bronze Trophies and a Morgan Trophy! The \$2,000 classes also pay using schedule B (pays farther down).

AGAIN IN 2025—7 YEAR OLD HORSES MUST CHOOSE - MATURBY OR DERBY: NRHA passed a rule in 2024 that restricts 7 year old horses from competing in a Maturity. This is the only aged event that does not allow show management to establish their own aged event requirements (i.e. show management can have a 4 year old only derby, a 4 year old Red Shirt Futurity, a Novice Horse Derby for 4, 5, 6, and 7 year olds, a Non Pro 3 & 4 year old Futurity, etc). LRRC Show Management recognizes not all 7 year olds are still competitive at the Derby level and for their longevity need the less stressful environment of the 7 and Up class we have been able to offer for many years (and that we have elected to now call the "Maturby"). The NRHA rule change was to eliminate the 7 year old who is still Derby level competitive from winning both the Derby and Maturity classes at a horse show. In keeping with the spirit of the rule change, all 7 year olds will be required to chose whether they want to compete in the Open Derby or Open Maturby AND whether they want to compete in the Non Pro Derby or Non Pro Maturby. They are not allowed to compete in both Open Aged Events or both Non Pro Aged Events.

FUTURITY/DERBY/MATURBY ENTRIES, CONDITIONS, & DRAWS: Futurity horses may be shown either one handed in a bridle or two handed in a snaffle bit or a hackamore. Maturby & Derby horses are to be shown one handed. All Derby/Futurity/Maturby entries must enter up one level (e.g. L1 must also enter a L2 or higher, L2 also a L3 or higher, L3 also in a L4 class). Entry in L4 4 YO or Novice Horse Derby classes fulfills 'enter up' criteria. Entry in the NP Prime Time or Masters Derby class must enter at least one class in the regular Derby (i.e. L1, L2, L3, or L4) or the L4 4YO Derby or Novice Horse Derby [but not required to enter up another class as well]. The 4 YO Derby and Novice Horse Derby classes are run concurrently with the Open and Non Pro Derby classes. 4 YO Derby classes are restricted to four year olds only. Novice Horse Derby classes are restricted to 4, 5, 6, or 7 YO horses who have not won more than \$2,500 NRHA lifetime earnings (as of the beginning of the year). To compete in the amateur division, the same horse/rider must be cross entered into one of the other Non Pro Derby classes. Regular Derby classes are open to 4, 5, 6, and 7 YOs. Draws will be determined at the draw party. Maturby draws will be done in conjunction with the ancillary classes they are being concurrently run with (computer drawn the night before). Additional entries will continue to be accepted until one hour before the start of the classes. However, once drawn, late additions will be the first to show. [Click here](#) to see the complete list of Aged Event Show Conditions, (includes specific details associated with the Non Pro Amateur Derby).

ADDITIONAL CLASS INFORMATION: PLEASE NOTE—ALL SHOW ENTRIES ARE DUE IN THE SHOW OFFICE BY 3:00 PM on the evening before each show day. The office will close from approximately 3:00 PM to 4:00 PM each day to prepare the draws for the following day. We anticipate the classes and schedule will be posted at approximately 6:00 PM on the evening before each show day (except Derby and Futurity classes which will be determined at the draw party and posted approximately 1 hour later). Class entries will continue to be accepted until 1 hour before the start of the classes; however, once drawn, late additions will be the first to show. Note that NRHA regulations prohibit refunding of entry fees once drawn. The draw schedule

for the main arena will take precedence over the draw schedule in the outdoor arena. Management, in its sole discretion, may alter the draw order to accommodate conflicts arising between the multiple arenas. The classes ran in Arena #2 are NRHA classes and the draw order must be followed as closely as possible. **IT IS THE RIDER'S RESPONSIBILITY TO REPORT TO THE GATE AND NOTIFY THE GATE STEWARD OF ANY CONFLICTS OR RISK BEING SCRATCHED FROM THE CLASS.** "Drag" periods are tentatively scheduled and may be altered from time-to-time after postings as deemed appropriate. Management reserves the right to alter the show, the arena, and schedules at any time as circumstances may dictate or as may be deemed appropriate.

65 YEAR OLD AND OLDER NON PROS: In case you didn't know it. The NRHA rule book allows those who turned 65 on or before January 1, to hold the saddle without incurring a 5 point penalty (in Non Pro classes only). In order to prevent the judges from inadvertently penalizing such actions it is imperative that they know who is and who is not allowed to do so. In order to properly implement this rule and not hold up the show, all those who meet this rule **MUST** check off the box on the entry form identifying they are of age and show proof in the show office prior to the draw being posted for their Non Pro class.

USE OF BLUETOOTH HEADSETS OR ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION DEVICES: NRHA rules allow the use of Bluetooth headsets or electronic communication devices, but considers it **illegal equipment in Category 2 & 6** (all our aged events), resulting in a no score. **Keep in mind that Maturby classes are Category 2 events even though they are being run concurrent with the Category 1 Ancillary Classes.** Please share to help inform each other of the rule details.

LEADLINE CLASS: A special GWRHA "Pee Wee Reiner"/Leadline class for children 7 and under will be held Saturday, October 4th after the Youth class. Contestants will be required to enter by 10am on Saturday, October 4th and to submit a short story line in writing ([click here for form](#)). Riders must be accompanied in the class by an adult who will lead the horse and rider at a walk. No "reining" maneuvers will be performed.

THE RUN FOR A MILLION QUALIFIER: Both slates #1 and #2 of the Rookie 1 and 2 and slates #1 and #2 of the Non Pro ancillary class have a concurrent TRFAM qualifier class. The cost to enter a class is \$250. The top 5 placers (plus ties) in each TRFAM class will qualify to compete at The Run For A Million to be held in Las Vegas the middle of **August 2026**. Qualification is for the rider; you are not required to ride the same horse at TRFAM event. All NRHA ownership rules will apply. Entry in TRFAM class does require entry in the concurrent Rookie 1, 2 and/or Non Pro ancillary class. TRFAM qualifier class has no payout; however, prizes are planned for the top 5 qualifiers. All specific TRFAM rules or conditions take precedence over any potential contradictions listed here. **NOTE: A Rookie rider who qualifies at this show will be able to compete at TRFAM in 2026, only if they are eligible for that class at the start of the 2026 show season.**

A production booth will also be on-site for viewing and ordering photographs.

VIDEO: [Rain Dancer Video](#) will provide video recording services and [live web casting](#) of the show over the internet. Their production trailer will be on-site and will offer free viewing and the ability to purchase videos of your runs. A delayed video feed station will also be provided near the warmup area. A \$10 video fee will be added by the show secretary for each run performed. **NOTE: Video orders placed at the show will receive a 50% discount.**

TEXT MESSAGING: Thanks to our sponsors, we will once again be offering text message alerts at the show. Go to the LowRollerReining.com website and enter your horse's number and choose how many horses before your go that you would like to be alerted. We will send you a text message every time you show. Tell your family and clients at home to sign up; no excuse for missing your run anymore!

Not only can you view live scoring and individual class standings, but now you can also see the contestant payouts (and how they change when the class standings change)!

PRODUCTION TEAM: Thanks to our production team of 2 See Media (Justin Rickelman), Rain Dancer Video (Dan Browning), and your host Dusty Sagers, we've been able to capture all the behind-the-scenes fun and excitement here at the shows and then share it with the rest of the world during the commercial draws! Justin will have a booth set up so you can watch him edit footage (like watching our other artisans down vendor row)! Stop by the GWRHA Lounge to sit and watch live runs in both arenas and all the latest video clips by this production team.

FORD IDAHO HORSE PARK RULES: Dogs are to always remain on a leash and under control. **NO DOGS** are allowed in any of the Ford Idaho Center Arenas, indoor warm up pen, or the Sports Center Concession and Office area **AT ANY TIME**. Please clean up after your animals. All horses to be washed in designated wash areas only (no washing in the stalls or alleyways). No horses allowed in the RV grounds. All overnight horses **MUST** be stalled (no stalling in or tying to trailers). No outside food, beverages, or alcohol may be brought into any building without the consent of the FIHP. Speed limit 10 mph. Exhibitors and invitees must comply with all FIHP rules and management directives.

CHANGES: As always, the show schedule is tentative and subject to change. GWRHA reserves the right to make changes, cancellations, or substitutions at any time. Show management may change, cancel, alter, or reschedule classes, arenas or any other show particulars due to weather or for any other reason, in its sole discretion, as may be dictated by circumstances at the time.

THE NORTHWEST AFFILIATE REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS (ARC):

- NRHA has still lifted all requirements for ARC class qualifications. You can enter any ARC class for which you meet the eligibility requirements of the adjacent ancillary class.
- All ARC entries that score above a zero are eligible to compete at the North American Affiliate Championships (NAAC) in OKC during the NRHA Futurity
- A NRHA Morrison Bronze will be awarded to the ARC winner in each class except the three Rookie and the three Youth classes, which will receive a NRHA Morgan Trophy. There are incredible NRHA corporate sponsored prizes to be won down a significant number of places.

TO BE ELIGIBLE TO COMPETE IN THE NORTHWEST AFFILIATE REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS YOU HAVE TO:

1. Be a current 2025 member of an Affiliate in the NW Region and show proof of membership to the Show Secretary. If you don't have one, you can join GWRHA for \$10/year, \$20 for a family.
2. Enter the ARC class (they run concurrently with the corresponding Ancillary Class and only one judges fee applies when entering both).
3. If you won an ARC class in another region you cannot enter that specific ARC class in this (or any other) region....so, enter a different ARC class and go win that one!
4. If you have questions ask in the show office, don't miss out on an opportunity to win additional great prizes and money!
